





4 Assessment Objectives:

- A01: Develop ideas from contextual sources demonstrating critical understanding (artist studies)
- A02: Explore and select resources, media & techniques (development and experimentation)
- A03: Record ideas, observations & insights relevant to intentions (drawing, photography & annotation)
- A04: Present a personal & meaningful final piece making connections with other assessment objectives (final pieces)

Coursework:

All lesson work from the beginning of the course will count towards this element (60%)

Exam:

The exam project (approx' 11 weeks) will be conducted in lessons followed by a 2 day exam to create a final piece (40%)

- Be an independent thinker & be committed to working outside of lessons
