What will I be studying in Health and Social Care?

- This qualification is made up of 3 different subject units.
- All students need to complete Units R032: principles of care in health and social care and R033: Supporting individuals through life events which are the two mandatory units
- In addition, the students will complete R034:
 Creative and therapeutic activities where the
 students will design and deliver a creative
 activity of their choice which would be aimed at
 a particular group as chosen by the exam board
 - which changes every year



Assessment overview

How and when will students be assessed

- Unit R032 is an examined unit where students will sit a one hour 15-minute examination paper, which is set and marked by OCR at the end of Year 11
- Units R033: Supporting individuals through life events and Unit R034: Creative and therapeutic activities are assessed through a series of tasks for a set assignment that they will be given. The assignments are set by OCR, marked by the teacher and then moderated by OCR
- Students will work on one piece of coursework at the start of Year 10 for submission in January and they will have an opportunity to improve on their coursework within the academic year for resubmission in May
- The same will happen in Year 11, in September students will complete the next piece of coursework for submission in January and if necessary, they will have an opportunity to improve on their work for resubmission in May



To be successful, you must



- Have an excellent work ethic this means that you need to catch up on any work missed and complete all the work to the best of your ability
- Be able to meet deadlines this is extremely important as the teacher needs to have the time to look through your work and give recommendations for improvements
- Be able to work with others and have good communication skills- you will be
 delivering a practical element of this course to a younger year group as part of the
 creative activity unit you will be studying
- Be able to contribute in lessons if you are planning on entering into a career in health care or social care, you must be able to talk to people and not be afraid to explain your thoughts
- **Be able to work independently** this means that the work/research you hand in is all your own. You will be asked to interview someone as part of your coursework and this needs to be done on your own
