- c) Record how many of each crime has been committed (due to lockdown you may want to look at January/February 2020 and/or last year's figures).
- d) Identify which are criminal and which are criminal and deviant.

<u>Task 3 - Research</u> all the types of crime below and include the following information;

- 1. An explanation for each type of crime.
- 2. An example/case study where each crime has been committed and reported in the news i.e white collar crime Bernie Madoff case
- a) White collar crime, e.g. organised, corporate, professional
- b) Moral crimes
- c) State crimes, e.g. Human rights
- d) Technological crimes, e.g.E-crimes, dark web
- e) Individual crimes this covers; hate crime, honour crime and domestic abuse

Task 4

For at least 3 of the criminals listed a to g, create a fact file that includes the following information:

- 1. The perpetrator(s) and their victim(s)
- 2. The crime committed
- 3. Details of their trial
- 4. Details of their sentence
- 5. What type of family circumstances did they grow up in
- 6. What type of education they had

- 7. Any Information about their background that might help explain their criminal behaviour. For example, head injury, mental illness, childhood and upbringing.
