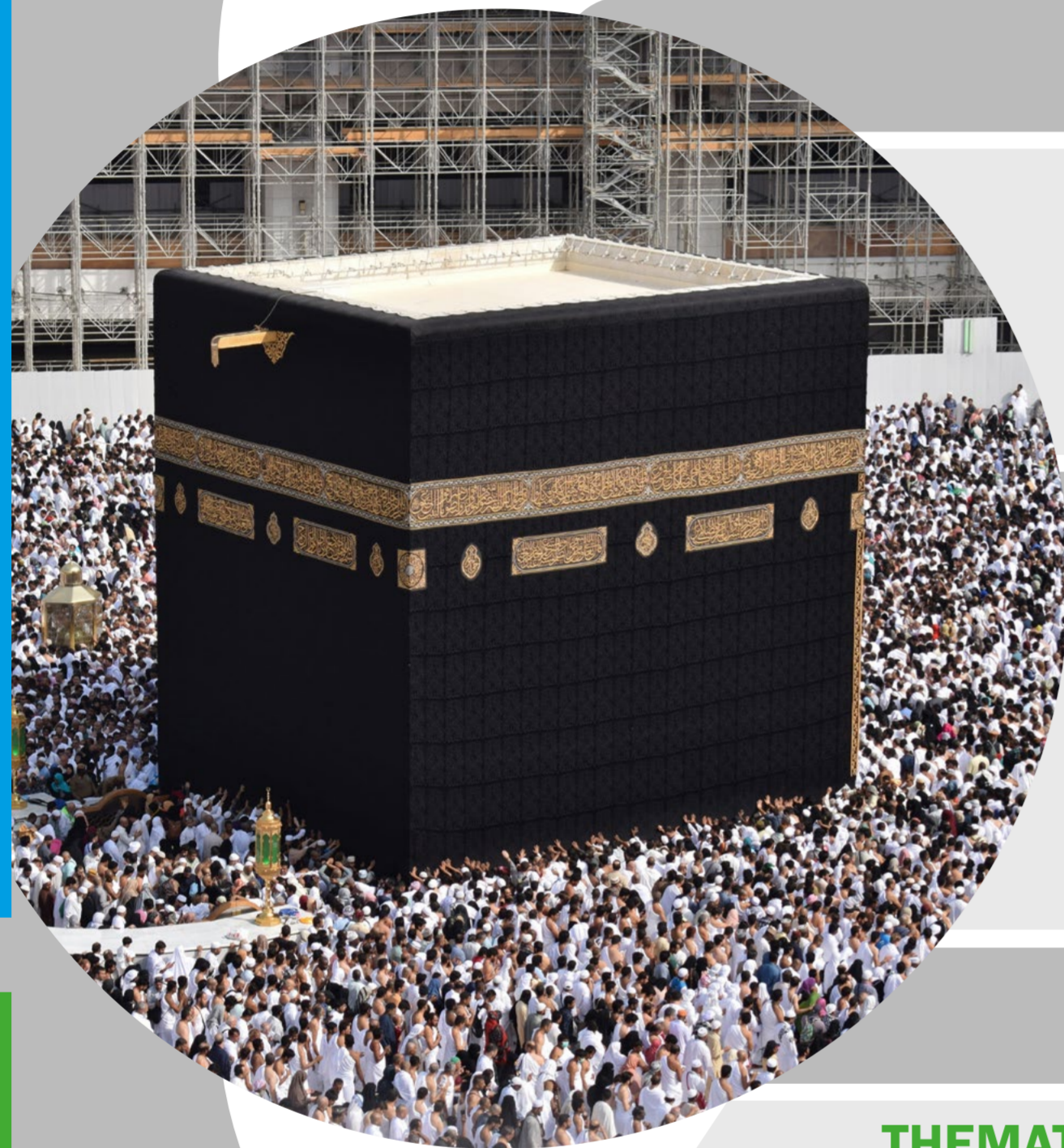

- Relate contemporary society and events to religious and non-religious perspectives of the world.



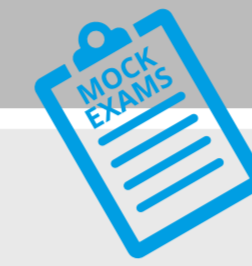

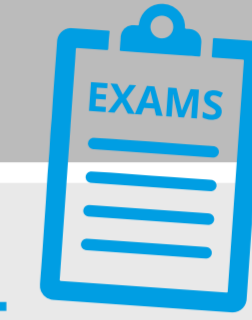
