- Work more independently, particularly through completing pre-reading prior to each lesson and taking responsibility by doing additional reading around the subject.



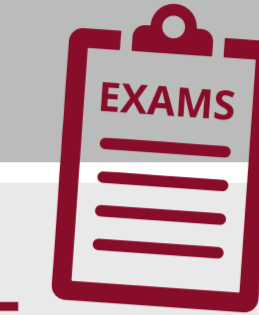

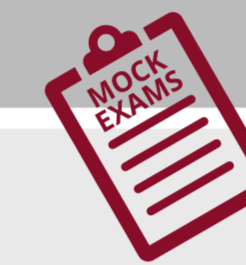

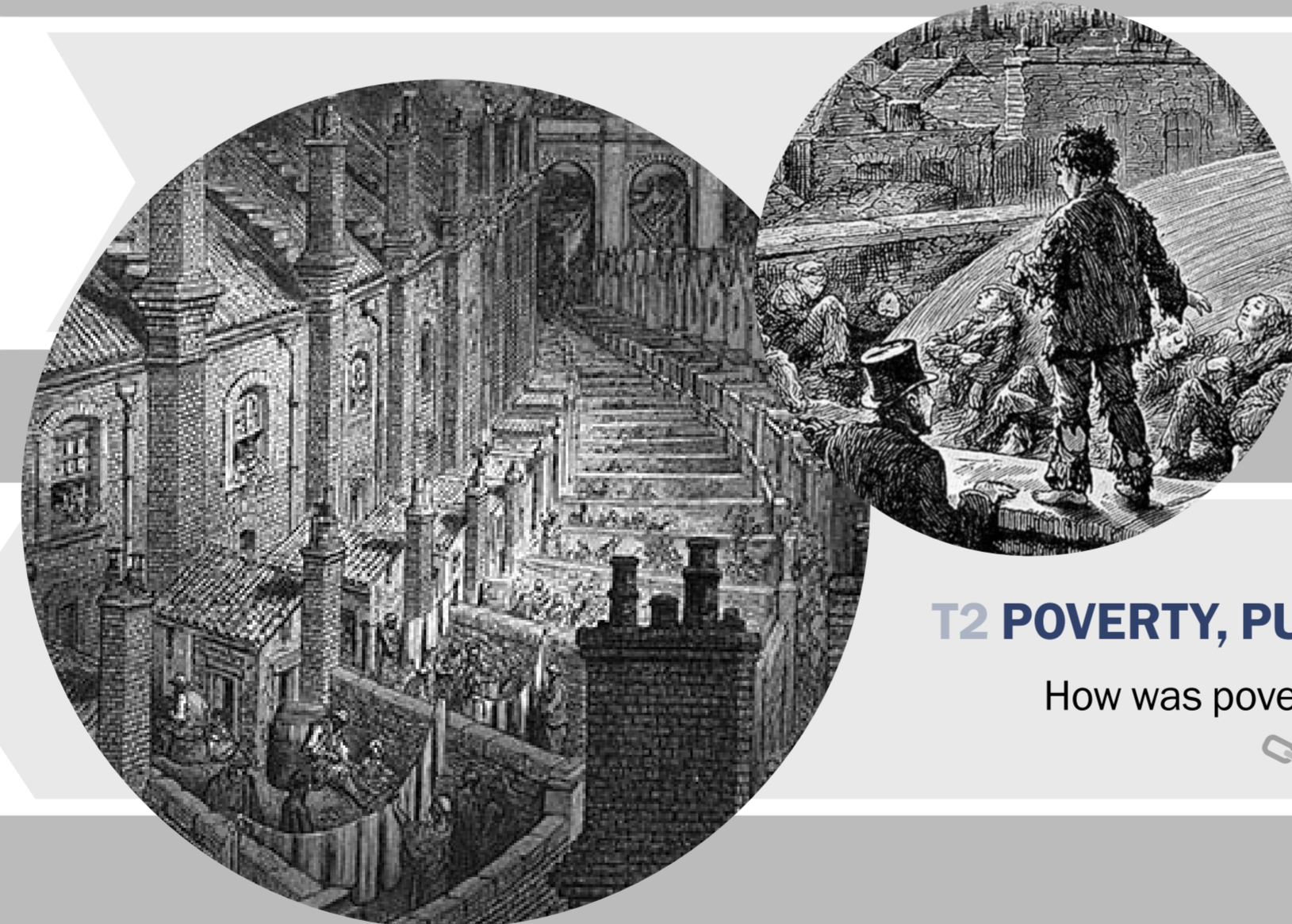
