



As a House, North currently has **155 students out of 257 that** have not received ANY negative behaviour points this term (that's over 60% of students in the House – what an achievement!)






I would love to highlight many others as most East House students have worked incredibly hard all term so please do not think your hard work has gone unnoticed.

I'm sure you're feeling very tired and ready for the school holiday. It has certainly been a challenging term but I am so proud of how well you have coped with the changes around school.



TUTOR READING PROGRAMME


In Years 7–10 we start every morning with 25 minutes reading led by the form tutor, in a programme designed to improve literacy, engage students with a range of challenging texts and stimulate a love of reading and literature. The texts are read out loud by the form tutor, with all students following with a ruler; this enables all students, no matter what their reading ability, to engage with and enjoy the book.

We have chosen 40 books which we believe are stimulating, challenging and will expose students to a wide range of genres and literary styles, from eighteenth century classics such as Pride and Prejudice, to modern Young Adult fiction such as The Poet X. It has created a calm and purposeful start to the day and it is wonderful to see just how much enjoyment students are getting from the texts.


